[00:00:00] From the Alex Trebek stage at Sony Picture Studios, this is Inside Jeopardy.

Sarah: Hello and welcome back to Inside Jeopardy, your exclusive and official destination for all things happening in the world of jeopardy. I'm Sarah Foss. I'm joined by executive producer Michael Davies.

Michael: Thanks so much for letting me come on your podcast, Sarah.

Oh, well, I really appreciate it. It is

Sarah: our podcast, Michael. Okay, and here we are in JPT as you like to call it. Yeah, we just finished. We just wrapped season 41,

Michael: wrapped yet another season, season 41 in the books.

Sarah: Yeah. 230 episodes. Who's counting?

Michael: Yeah, of original 46 weeks original recipe. Jeopardy.

Sarah: Yeah. So we're gonna head into reruns, but that's not for a while because in JAT

we've got all sorts of fun things going on, but you know, since we spoke last on the pod uhhuh, that was our live event.

Michael: Yes.

Sarah: In the nation's capitol. Yes. Washington dc That's the last time we spoke to our folks since it's, you know, we're more monthly now. Yeah.

Michael: That went so well.

Sarah: It did.

Michael: I didn't expect it to go that well, but it really did go well.

That was, we was, we all came back from there. So [00:01:00] excited about Japanese, so excited. To, uh, come to your city to go everywhere around the country. Uh, we have grand plans in the future of inside Jeopardy. Live around. Yeah. Do you, novation, do you wanna, do you

Sarah: wanna hint to where we may be headed or you wanna keep that a secret for right now?

Michael: Well, look, we've, we've done events in New York. We've done events in Los Angeles. The next two biggest markets in the country where we haven't been yet are Chicago and Philadelphia. And so maybe those two. Yeah. Uh, may be coming up. Big

Sarah: jeopardy markets. Very big Jeopardy. Markets

Michael: massive for us in every way,

Sarah: and we keep selling out.

So, you know, someone likes this little pod and they certainly like this little show, but we've also had a recent celebrity Jeopardy champion named Oh wow. Season three. Oh,

Michael: I know W Kamal Bell. Uh, please go. It's a substack, actually, I think it's gonna be on jeopardy.com. By the time, uh, you're able to watch this and Kamal wrote so beautifully about his experience on celebrity Jeopardy here with his whole family and, and how much the brand means to him.

He's been such a great discovery for us. Such a great evangelist. For the Jeopardy and [00:02:00] Celebrity Jeopardy brand and Jeopardy Masters. He's posting about that as well. Yes. Um, really worth the read. Yeah. He, he won an amazing, uh, final and another great champion, you know, really Ike Lisa Ann now, uh, w Kamal Bell, they are our celebrity Jeopardy masters themselves.

Sarah: Yes. And we will hopefully be seeing w Kamau Bell along with Lisa and Walter. In the Tournament of Champions.

Michael: Wow. Two of them.

Sarah: Now, since we've seen you on the podcast, we've had some more champions added to the roster. So we just wanna take a look at where the Tournament of Champions roster stands right now.

Of course, we've got our Celebrity Jeopardy winners, Lisa and Walter and W Kamal Bell. We've got those with five plus wins like Laura fada with eight wins, Josh Kart, Andrew Hayes, and Liam Starns with six wins. Ben Ger with five. Now those are the guarantees, but historically we know in recent years, yeah, those four game champs are getting in as well.

So far we have Ashley Chan, Alex DeFrank, and Bryce Morgan. All with four [00:03:00] wins

Michael: well already, uh, shaping up to be another. Incredible, uh, TOC and that's before we've even layered in, you know, the people from Sarah's Second Chance tournament, uh, and the Champion's Wild Card, uh, into the entire. I just

Sarah: love how it's become Sarah's second chance.

It's alliterative. No, but you know, other great minds do, uh. Do chime in. Michael,

Michael: I love seeing who you pick. I know through the, through the season, it's like every day there's another second chancer who's a Yeah. Is, or maybe five who are more candidates. I know. So we've got more, we have more potential second chances than we have space for, I think this coming season, yes.

It's been a great,

Sarah: but we are, we are looking at potentially doing more than two weeks. Yeah. But all things that we'll consider. Yeah. In the off season. Now in JAT, also last night on A, B, C, and prime time. We wrapped up the knockout rounds.

Michael: Yeah.

Sarah: Dun, dun.

Michael: Amazing stuff. Uh, you know, in this new expanded jeopardy masters field, we eliminate three players at the end of the knockouts.

And, uh, [00:04:00] we found out who was gonna join Adriana, uh, last night. Uh, and unfortunately it's goodbye to Brad Rutter. It was so great to see him back. Uh, on the Jeopardy stage and goodbye to Nilesh. Still an amazing player. You know, we saw in his first game, which I wrote about, uh, on jeopardy.com and on my Substack, um, I wrote about like, he just had a few key moments in that game against Isaac, but it could have turned it, he could have won that opening game, and then I think he learned a lot.

Mm-hmm. Uh, as the tournament went on. I think he'll be back. Uh, again, and I think he will do even better, but we say goodbye to those three.

Sarah: Well, you mentioned your Substack. Yes. You've been busy with that, Michael? Yes. Tell us about

Michael: it. I've just, I was very moved, and this is partly from going, uh, in Washington where we spoke at the National Portrait Gallery for an event for the White House Historical Association.

Then I went down to Chapman University and I spoke at Dodge College, um, about Jeopardy, and I was sort of moved that I should start writing about the show. I, I love talking about it and I felt I should start writing about it, so. Every [00:05:00] week after Jeopardy Masters, I've been posting on jeopardy.com and on my substack at Embassy Davis if you wanna check it out there.

And, um. You know, writing about what it feels like to be in the control room. The, the blog is called From the Control Room. And if, in fact, in Jeopardy Masters, I sit right there on the stage next to producer Sarah Foss, and we get this front row seat, it's like floor seats at the Knicks versus the Celtics.

Mm-hmm. Uh, watching, uh, watching superstars, watching the greats and noticing things that we would never. Ever notice, um, if we weren't right there.

Sarah: Yeah. Well, next Tuesday we will kick off the quarterfinals Tuesday and Wednesday in primetime. But we just wanna hear how our masters were feeling heading in to this incredible tournament.

Take a listen.

Juveria: When you lose your first game, you think it's over. And now, four tournaments later to be here is just extraordinary. I still am pinching myself. I

can't believe I'm here. But, uh, it was a long road and we did it, and now it's time to enjoy.

Isaac: I went into ative champions with a lot of pressure both.

Internally and [00:06:00] externally, and I feel none of that pressure. Here I am. No one expects me to win this thing. My parents don't expect me to win this thing. My girlfriend only kind of does, so I'm, I'm prepared to just, whatever happens, happens, I'm here to hopefully. Do well and have fun,

Matt: feeling good. Uh, no one's under my belt, uh, so far, but I'm looking to change that this year.

Neilesh: Right now I'm just trying to soak in the moment and, uh, really trying to try to enjoy because I don't feel like I've enjoyed my first few times on jeopardy to the fullest extent. I feel like I've been more focused on competing.

Roger: This is an amazing field and I think anyone can win this. Uh, I'm very confident in my own self, but.

I know this is going to be a really tough tournament.

Adriana: It's such a more intense experience because it's playing against the best of the best players of Jeopardy.

Yogesh: I exceeded my expectations last year. Uh, and yeah, just, you know, I mean, I. Whatever happens, happens.

Victoria: There is a lot more pressure on me this year.

Last year I didn't think that [00:07:00] anybody had any expectations on me whatsoever. I didn't really have any expectations on myself. Um, this year I would like to prove that it's not a fluke that I, that I got through last year.

Brad: Usually if I was on this stage and I heard Ken's voice, it was bad news because it meant he buzzed in in front of me.

So, uh, yeah, that'll take some getting used to. So, uh, we'll see how it goes.

Sarah: All right. Let's take a look at the highlights in Masters. So far. We premiered with our reigning champion, Victoria Gross Runner up Yogesh route, and the highest money winner of all time. Brad Rudder Yogesh was on fire with this game in this game, 24 correct responses, two big daily doubles totalling over 10,000 points.

He ended double jeopardy. With 30,800 points and a very convincing runaway in game one.

Michael: Yeah, I, uh, I referred to Yogesh as the Fernando Alonzo of, uh, jeopardy. He's, you know, JE Fernando Alonzo, the F1 driver, known for being [00:08:00] so fast. Uh, you know, out of the, out of the start and. That's what Yogesh has done so far in this tournament.

He comes on the stage, very calm and collected. There's that buzzer. The, he has the high right hand buzzer and he gets right out there and he aggressively gets in. At the beginning, I think he set the two highest, uh, jeopardy rounds in master's history, um, in his first game and in his second game. And he just comes right out and he, he puts you on notice that if you want to.

Play him in this tournament, you'd better really, really come back hard against him because he's starting superbly.

Sarah: Yeah. Well after that. Very convincing First one, let's hear how Yogesh was feeling.

Ken: Victoria and Brad. Uh, I think I know the answer to this firsthand sometimes from playing Brad, but how did it feel going up against Yogesh in that game?

Victoria: I mean, there was a lot of stuff I wanted to get in on that I did not get in on, which, you know, you expect in this tournament.

Ken: You were dialed in on the buzzer yos. That's what I'm hearing.

Yogesh: I mean, it has always felt random to me, but yeah. [00:09:00]

Ken: You've had a bit of a break from Jeopardy, Brad, and you said you were concerned about getting your b your buzzer mojo back.

Brad: No, I'm very concerned.

Ken: There were moments in that game, right?

Brad: Yeah, yeah. Uh, no, but, uh, especially the first couple clues of double jeopardy, I'm like, okay, here I go. If I can get it on these. You know, do 'em both cold, but you know, what are you gonna do?

Ken: Well, it was great to see all three of you back on the Alex Trebek stage, uh, yogis.

You acquitted yourself very well. Do you feel like that gave you a boost of confidence for the next time you play? You're, you're in the lead at the moment?

Yogesh: I mean, it's, it's jeopardy. Anything can happen at any point. Um, there's no guarantees. So, you know, you just. Do the best you can and hope things fall your way.

Um, it's nice to have a little bit of a cushion, but you know, it's, it's very early in the tournament.

Ken: Well, with players of this caliber. I have no doubt that we are gonna see like, very strong runs from both Victoria and Brad down the road. Okay. In

Michael: the second game of the night, we saw the rematch of out JIT finalists.

Madam Modio, Roger Craig Juve are here. It was a close game between all three of them until Roger [00:10:00] found both daily doubles in double jeopardy to take the lead into final. All three players were correct, but Roger secured the win from the lead. What a game.

Sarah: Yeah. It's interesting because obviously in the JIT it was pretty much all Madam Modio.

Yeah. He won it in two games. Something we haven't seen someone do in the jit mm-hmm. Yet. Uh, and here we come back and here's Roger just taking it. It really proves anyone can win in a game of Jeopardy.

Michael: Yes. You know, the writing, I have to say the writing in Jeopardy, masters, our writers, Billy and Michelle, and the whole team.

Um, pull together. It's the highest level of writing we do all year. It's the highest difficulty of categories. I think our whole team, the writers, the researchers, the game material clue, the, the, the pictures, the video categories, Sarah, that you go out and direct all across the country. We really bring our A game.

Here, there was just this absolutely wonderful thunderbolts category that we did to promote the, uh, promote the Marvel movie. Um, but not

Sarah: about the movie. No. About thunderbolts and literature and music and, yeah. Yes,

Michael: that's what, uh, Michelle Loud [00:11:00] went out and found that Bohemian Rhapsody lyric, thunderbolts and lightning.

Very, very frightening. And from there she brainstormed, you know, various clues about thunderbolt lightning and, and loud explosions from classical music, from popular culture. It was really superbly done.

Sarah: Yes, and you have to think that for Matt, this was his third time being in Masters. But

Michael: yeah,

Sarah: for Juve and Roger, this was their first game.

So let's hear how they were feeling after that first debut.

Ken: I'm looking at the stats and that was a very close game. You three were neck and neck, daily doubles hooked you up there, Roger.

Roger: Yeah. Thank goodness for those.

Ken: Have you made a science of looking for them? Do you feel like that's more a skill or luck at this point for you?

Roger: I think it's like, uh, having a dousing rod trying to find water. Yeah.

Ken: Is it any consolation, Matt and Java, that, you know, you were playing at Roger's level in that game, even if, uh, the daily doubles went his way?

Juveria: Yeah, I, you know, I think for me. I could not buzz in the jet finals at all. Like we're looking at like six outta 26 and six outta 20, and I've been moaning and groaning about it for two days to these guys, um, which I'm sure they [00:12:00] really loved hearing, um, but it felt, felt better today.

Um, and it's just so much fun to play with people who have become friends and, um, you know, we'll, we'll figure out how we're gonna deal with Roger later, but, uh,

Matt: gonna borrow. Gonna borrow the dowsing rod.

Ken: Tell me about wagering in this competition, Matt, that's, that's the longest I've ever seen you think about a number in final jeopardy because the strategy's different, right?

With these match points, talk us through that.

Matt: Not, not just the match points, but the uh uh. Two games before a third of us disappear. Very different from all the masters that I remember back in the day.

Ken: Uh, and so we switched it up on even a masters veteran like Matt Modio.

Matt: Yeah. So, uh, the value of one point in the first game, uh, is very different this year compared to the last two.

Ken: It is kind of rough that we're gonna lose three of you after just three games, which is very sad for us. But it's not

Matt: too late to change it

Ken: legally. It is, in fact, too late to change it. Matt, uh, they get very angry if I just call out rule changes from the, uh, from the stage. No one [00:13:00] likes that.

Sarah: All right.

Next up we had our third knockout game. Michael, thank you for paying attention. Okay, good. This was the rematch of the Tournament of Champions Finals. We had Adriana Meyer, we had Isaac Hirsh, and of course Niles Vja, muy, and they all wanted to win in this one.

Michael: Yeah, the kids, the kids I was watching on the stage, I turned around, uh, looked at Sam Butchery who sits in the, the, the front row of the VIP.

Of course. Yeah. And we gave each other the look that only two men of a certain age can give each other when we're in the presence of youthful brilliance. It was that. Oh wow. They're getting younger and younger and, uh, the kids were there, they were kind of nervous. Mm-hmm. Yeah. In this game. Um, but wow.

What a performance.

Sarah: Yeah, it was, uh, you know, a close game between Isaac and Les, but then Isaac kind of just steadily built a lead in double jeopardy. Eventually he found that last daily double, halfway through the round, he adds 4,000 points to his lead. Yeah. And then he was able to secure a runaway against Les who took the whole thing.

Yeah. So Isaac had to be peeling pretty good in that [00:14:00] moment.

Michael: Key, key moments in that game. Throughout with daily double finding some incorrect responses, uh, from Niles and then the heartbreak on final jeopardy where he changed his response. Mm-hmm. Um, from Saint Columba, which was the correct response to St.

Columba. Yeah. Uh, which was not, um, you know, tough, tough going.

Sarah: And we talked about w Kamau Bell. He had a very special category. Yeah. In that show.

Michael: Bell's. Bells.

Sarah: Bell's. Bells.

Michael: Yeah. And that was Marcus Brown writer, Marcus Brown went to the library. Yes. Read Kamal's book. Found out all these details of Kamal's life where you could take sort of slum dog, millionaire style.

You could take Kamal's life and sort of incorporate bells into it. Or people with the last name bell, or things that would ring in some way. And, uh, wrote a brilliant category that Kamal delivered so beautifully, um, uh, on camera. Yeah. It was magic. Sarah: Well, and I get the pleasure of being there as. Kamau is reading these clues and he got so excited.

He is like, oh my [00:15:00] gosh, how did they know that? How did they find that at? Really just a testament to our writers and how hard they work at these incredible categories. Isaac feeling pretty good after this win, hoping for a second one. But you know, knowing that he would be returning for a second game because of that win.

Let's hear how he was, uh, thinking in this moment.

Ken: Isaac, congratulations. Thank you. It looked like Niles was running away with this thing and then. Suddenly you made a charge. Did anything change on your end? What happened

Isaac: there? Well, yeah, I was, I, I said I was gonna do a new buzzer strategy coming into Masters, and that was horrible and it didn't work at all.

So I went back to just looking at the lights again, and it worked a lot better. So,

Ken: final, turned out to be a moot point. You had more than doubled up on Ne and Adriana, but it was very close. You had St. Colomba

Neilesh: ne I mean, I, I've definitely heard of St. Colomba before, but then, uh, you know, he, as you said, first impulse, second impulse, you know, things like that happen.

Uh, you know, I, I'm gonna walk it off and. It'll be back stronger for the next,

Ken: I mean, sometimes that's a smart strategy. Yeah. Like kicking the tires on your response. I mean, that's what you gotta do. Yeah. Well done. [00:16:00] I didn't realize, Neil, you're such a horror movie guy. Is that true? You're a horror buff?

Neilesh: Uh, yeah.

I did watch a ton of horror movies. Uh, I, I was really, uh, thrilled that the strangers came up, uh, that long legs came, came up. So, uh, those were movies that I definitely watched. Uh, between the time, my first game and now. Have you been watching a bunch of movies

Ken: in TV to prep for Jeopardy

Neilesh: Master? Yeah, for sure.

I've been trying to watch whatever I can, but you know, it's the horror movies that, uh, I really liked the most.

Ken: Isaac, you had some tough clues as well. Uh, how did you know Vista? The volunteer group?

Isaac: Uh, this was sort of a slum dog millionaire game where a bunch of stuff I specifically looked up in the past couple months came up, including Vista, which I would've never gotten, otherwise, I'd never heard of it before.

I saw a, a previous question on it, so. Keep doing that. Please keep asking me about things. I just looked up.

Ken: It was a past jeopardy clue and you, it made you read up on, on Vista. Yep. Any predictions for game two tonight?

Isaac: Uh, you know, we won the first game. That's all that matters. Not really anticipating getting a match point in that one.

Ken: You could go to a no tonight, you know, or at least win the widest collar award.

Isaac: I, I will, I will win the widest collar. [00:17:00]

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And now back to Inside Jeopardy.

Michael: Heading into our fourth knockout game where we saw first game winners, Yogesh Route, Roger Craig and Isaac Ksh. Face off once again. We witnessed a dominant and record setting jeopardy, round by Yogesh earning him a massive lead. Heading into double jeopardy. Then Isaac and Roger were unable to climb outta the hole while Yos cruised.

Another runaway win.

Sarah: Yeah. And this meant that all three of these players had now locked up their spots. Yeah. In the [00:19:00] quarterfinals had to feel good. And for those who were playing in Game five, a lot at stake. So in last night's episode for our final two games in the knockouts, first up, we had all of our second place finishers.

So we tried to kind of. Align it with the winners. Yeah. The second place finishers and then the third place finishers. This was Victoria Gross. Surprising to see her in second. Yeah. Matt Amodio and Adriana Meyer, Victoria took a pretty good lead into double jeopardy thanks to of course a \$4,800 daily double Matt close behind in second.

Then Victoria finds the last daily double, she adds 5,000 points to extend her lead. Mm-hmm. Ends up working her way to a runaway three match points for her. Her spot in the quarterfinals is secure. Matt gets the one and he's also headed to the quarterfinals.

Michael: Yeah, and this just in from the stats department.

Victoria had 42 buzzer attempts in this game. 29 successful buzz ins. That's a 69% success rate. That's the second highest buzzer conversion rate for buzzer conversion rate enthusiasts in master's history [00:20:00] behind only James Holts, our's season one record. Wow. He had 70% on 50 buzzes.

Sarah: Wow. And then we head into knockout game six.

Michael: Yeah, our final knockout game, we saw our third place finishes compete for the last spot in the quarter finals. Just one spot going here. So the stakes are really, really high. Nilesh Benjamin Murray Aria are here, and Brad Rutter. It was tense in the studio. Brad went on a tear in the jeopardy round and with 15 correct responses, he took the lead into double jeopardy.

We were all thinking, Brad is back. Brad is back. Yes, totally. And now seeing the real Brad. But Daria, with the help of both daily doubles in double jeopardy, took a strong lead into final where she secured the win. On a triple stumper

Sarah: and we learned that Veria has actually been getting tips in pop culture from none other than our pop culture.

Jeopardy champions, the personality hires.

Michael: I know amazing stuff. They, they're

Sarah: helping her study. I love this. I know. Jeopardy community, the

Michael: various worlds of Jeopardy are, are talking to each other in various ways.

Sarah: Delighting, it's [00:21:00] fabulous. Let's hear how Juve was feeling, knowing she's headed to the quarter final.

Ken: What an incredible game. You had a real head of steam there, uh, Brad, but then juvie found the daily doubles in the second round and you took advantage of that.

Juveria: When you play at this high of a level, I think it all comes down to variance and that's, I guess, the jeopardy. In jeopardy.

Ken: You had to bet big though, like you did not look happy when you said, maybe this is the last time I'll ever say this, but you know,

Juveria: it's, um.

We've been reflecting a lot as a family about this journey and, you know, four tournaments taking up this much time. So every moment here, you know, I take everything in and to see the last, that daily bubble, it's like, maybe this is the last time

Ken: I do remember thinking the same thing during the Go tournament.

Like, uh, I really don't feel like I have much of a chance against these two, but like, I really wanna enjoy it. You know, we knew it was gonna be maybe our last time playing with Alex, certainly, and, uh. We wanted to enjoy that. I really hope this is the, not the last time we're seeing ne and Brad because, uh, like you two represent everything I love to watch about Jeopardy.

That was such a great game, Brad, in that game, you were able to prove [00:22:00] that like you can still play at a very high jeopardy level. I hope. I hope you enjoyed that.

Brad: It was nice to prove that I could still hang. But at the same time, you know this, I'm not as good as I used to be. You, you can feel it, right? I know.

Yeah. I mean, I'm 47 for God's sake. Oh wow. I mean, like that, that's gonna take a toll. So yeah, it's nice to know that I can still play up here, but again, it's like, you know, when do you hang them up?

Ken: I personally would love to see you up here again. It's always fun. It always takes me back to my most crippling jeopardy, defeat.

So that's, that's always nice. Uh,

Brad: well, we'll always have those memories, Ken.

Sarah: All right, and with that, Yogish takes the lead heading into the Quarterfinal six match points for him. Victoria and Roger, both with four points, juve and Isaac tied with three match points. Madam Modio, surprising to see him in the sixth spot, but he's got two match points.

All these points roll over into the quarterfinals, so you gotta tune in on Tuesday and see how things unfold.

Michael: Yeah, I can't wait. I was here and I can't wait. [00:23:00] I sort of know how it turned out, but I can't remember at this point. So I'm just excited to watch along with all of you.

Sarah: Well, it's been a minute since we've had a host chat, but Ken's certainly been chatting a lot Yeah.

Since we last spoke. So an audience member wanted to know, you know, do you ever think, wow, that was really hard.

Ken: I do like, that's my favorite thing is when they surprise me. 'cause I'm like. You guys, I think this is because I'll tell the writers, this one seems really hard. Like I, you know, it's been a while since I was on Jeopardy, but from my point of view, and then when the players know it, you know, it's humbling of course, but like it's exciting.

Like look at that. Good for them. If, if you ever hear me say like, wow, well done on the show, that probably is your clue that Ken did not know that one. Uh,

Sarah: Michael, can you believe it? We've reached the end.

Michael: Did. That's it. We're never doing this again.

Sarah: Well, no, we're gonna do it again on June 5th.

Michael: Oh, good. Okay.

'cause then

Sarah: we can talk about all things masters. It will have just concluded. Yeah. We'll of course have our winning interview with whoever the masters champion will be.

Michael: Yeah.

Sarah: And who knows what else is gonna happen in the world of Jeopardy before then.

Michael: Wow. And [00:24:00] JPTI then go into MPT, which is Millionaire Production Time.

Oh, right, yes. Or ww, TBA letters, MPT. That's a lot of letters. Uh, which we're doing June 6th, seventh, and eighth in Los Angeles. So. Wow. I'm, I'm Quiz showed out.

Sarah: Is there such a thing?

Michael: Yeah, maybe. Well,

Sarah: thanks for watching this edition of Inside Jeopardy. We'll see you next time.
