CLAY JACOBSEN NAMED DIRECTOR OF 'JEOPARDY!'

Chloe Corwin Promoted To Associate Director

CULVER CITY, CALIF. (June 26, 2018) – Clay Jacobsen has been named the director of **JEOPARDY!**, following the retirement of Kevin McCarthy. Chloe Corwin has been promoted to associate director, succeeding Jacobsen.

Jacobsen grew up in California's Central Valley before starting a freelance career as a camera operator in Las Vegas before becoming a technical director and, eventually, a director. His other directing credits include "Prime Time Country with Gary Chapman" "Entertainment Tonight," "John & Leeza," "Dr. Laura," "The Dove Awards," "The Other Half," "Dennis Miller," "The Florence Henderson Show," "American Idol Extra," "Ellen," "Gameday Final" (NFL Network), along with many other specials, variety shows and sporting events.

Over the past 16 years, Chloe Corwin has held a variety of production positions at **JEOPARDY!** and its sister show, "Wheel Of Fortune," and she literally grew up around both shows. Her father, the late Mark Corwin, was the Emmy Award-winning director of "Wheel Of Fortune." In 1976, he married Chloe's mother Robin (neé Kenner) when she, too, was a member of Wheel's production staff. Chloe's brother Michael is currently a camera operator on "Wheel Of Fortune."
