Two-Week Event Featuring 15 Elite Educators Presented by Amazon Alexa

CULVER CITY, CALIF. (April 29, 2019) – Next week is Teacher Appreciation Week, and <u>JEOPARDY!</u> will show its support for the nation's educators when the Teachers Tournament presented by Amazon Alexa starts Monday, May 6. The two-week event features 15 educators competing for the \$100,000 grand prize and a spot in the next Tournament of Champions.

"Teachers are the only profession for whom we've created a special tournament, which I hope shows how much everyone at **JEOPARDY!** values their work," said **JEOPARDY!** host Alex Trebek. "This group of contestants will certainly make their students and their communities proud."

This year's edition of the Teachers Tournament is presented by Amazon Alexa, and Alexa will be onhand to assist Alex Trebek throughout the tournament. Additionally, each of the Teachers Tournament contestants will receive an Echo device. The <u>JEOPARDY! Skill for Alexa</u> allows users to play **JEOPARDY!** on any Alexa-enabled device with a single voice command: "Alexa, play **JEOPARDY!**." The Skill continues to grow in popularity since its launch in 2016.
